Because the businesses are constructively "confiscated" by being controlled through regulation and excessive taxes.

Why is the common sharing of goods in the Book of Acts not socialism.

Because the sharing was voluntary not a command

Nobody turned over the means of production to the state

Charity is an act of worship not a duty to the government

William Wilberforce

Led the Christian members of Parliament

Fought against the slave trade for over 20 years

Delivered powerful speeches that appealed to the Christian conscience of Englishmen

The early church was surrounded by a culture that honored life. False

After leading the great revivals in the 1820s, Evangelist Charles Finney

Joined Oberlin College in 1836 and helped lead the abolitionist movement

The first president of the revivalist school, Lane Theological Seminary in Ohio.

Lyman Beecher, father of Harriet Beecher Stowe

White abolitionists in the South

Said Christians were morally obligated to destroy slavery

Suffered harshly for their stand against slavery

Modeled Berea College in Kentucky after Oberlin College

In Islam, Muhammad taught that if you are not part of the Ummah (the Tribe)

You are less than human

In SD v MJR 2010, a New Jersey court

Said hat a Muslim was protected from rape charges due to his religion

Thomas Jefferson and John Adams were told by the Muslims

that all nations who should not have acknowledged their authority were sinners

In the report on Islam by John Quincy Adams, Adams notes

The commands of the prophet may be performed alike, by fraud, or by force.

This appeal to the natural hatred of the Muslim towards the infidels is in just accordance with the precepts of the Quran.
